- a. Trustee/Superintendent/Principal Announcements
 - i. *Interim Supt. Neu reported the following:*
 - Interim Supt. Neu said it was a pleasure to attend the 8th grade graduation on June 10th, describing it as beautiful and heartfelt. The ceremony was held outdoors, behind the MPR. Decorations, coordinated by Lillian Ayroso, were very festive.

- Board President Elaine Doss' wonderful speech included a personalized message to each student addressed his/her individual goals for success in the future. Principal Snekkevik's affection and concern for the graduates was apparent in her speech and everyone in attendance felt embraced by her.
- o Interim Supt. Neu attended the recent public health meeting for the community at which it was reported that 95% of schools in Marin County have returned to inperson instruction. She credited the collaborative efforts of the team led by Mary Jane Burke and Dr. Lisa Santora for that success rate. New CDC guidelines are coming out and Marin County schools will follow the state's COVID protocols. Masks will be required indoors, students and staff can be mask-free outdoors, and students will also be able to mix at recess and at lunch. Schools will be required to create 10-point Covid Safety Plans (CSP) for 2021-22. Key among the new plan will be washing hands, staying home if sick, wearing masks indoors, and weekly testing of unvaccinated staff. The school can and will require vaccinations for all new hires and parent volunteers. Another public health meeting for the community will be held in August.
- On a legal note, the Brown Act's temporary allowance of remote Board meetings will expire September 30. The October Board meeting will be held in-person.
