# Agreement for Display of Historic Photos and Miwok Scale Model

Nicasio Historical Society of PO Box 111, Nicasio, CA 94946 ("NHS") displays certain items on the premises of Nicasio School, located at 5555 Nicasio Valley Rd, Nicasio, CA 94946 ("Nicasio School"). These items include the following ("NHS Exhibit"):

- 22 black and white photos in varying sizes of Nicasio School students from years 1888 through 2012;
- Five black and white photos of varying sizes;
- Eight text information boards about the Miwok exhibit; and
- A 3'x4' scale model of a Miwok Village

Five photographs of the NHS Exhibit are attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein.

The NHS Exhibit shall remain on the premises of Nicasio School at the discretion of NHS and Nicasio School and on the condition that it is on display in the Nicasio School library. If Nicasio School permanently removes the NHS Exhibit from the library, it must be returned to NHS no later than ten days following removal. However, Nicasio School may temporarily remove or relocate NHS Exhibit for library cleaning or maintenance, so long as it is returned to the Nicasio School library within a reasonable amount of time.

NHS may permanently or temporarily remove the NHS Exhibit, in whole or in part, for a specific period of time mutually agreed upon by NHS and Nicasio School. NHS shall be in charge of removal, returning, and re-staging, subject to Nicasio School's availability and approval.

NHS bears the responsibility of protecting the condition of the NHS Exhibit. Notwithstanding the above, Nicasio School shall not change the display location of the NHS Exhibit without prior approval from NHS.

**Waiver of Liability.** In consideration of NHS's use of the premises of Nicasio School, NHS does hereby release, waive, discharge, and covenant not to sue Nicasio School, its trustees, administrators, employees, or agents for/from liability from any and all claims, including negligence, resulting from personal injury, accidents, illnesses, and property damage and loss or theft of the NHS Exhibit, in whole or in part.

**Assumption of Risk.** NHS acknowledges that entry in the premises of Nicasio School is at NHS's own risk and assumes all risks associated with entry, including but not limited to falls, contacts with other people, the condition of the premises, and any other personal injury or damage to NHS Exhibit that results from the use of the Nicasio School premises.

**Indemnification and Hold Harmless.** NHS also agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Nicasio School, its trustees, administrators, employees, and agents from any and all claims, actions, suits, costs, expenses, damages, and liabilities, including attorney fees, as a result of the use of the Nicasio School premises. NHS further agrees to reimburse Nicasio School any costs incurred resulting from entry and use of said premises in connection with the NHS Exhibit.

Dear Parents,

Thank you to all of the parents who participated in this year's annual school survey. A total of 40 parent responses were collected from our 28 families. While 100% participation is always desirable, sufficient data has been collected to provide important and valuable information to the school. Your feedback will be shared with teachers, staff and school board members to help guide current and future decisions and practices.

Many of your responses are honest and heartfelt, which is greatly appreciated. However, due to the small and personal nature of our school community, specific comments are not appropriate to share in the context of a public forum. Therefore, to protect confidentiality and matters of a personal nature, parents' comments have been omitted. This summary has been designed to share the overall results in a way that represents parents' opinions accurately while protecting the privacy of teachers, staff, students and parents. 
Our office has completed its review of the Nicasio School District's second interim budget report for 2017-18 in compliance with the provisions of Education Code 42131(a)(2). The Code requires the County Superintendent to approve or disapprove interim report certifications after:

Examining the report to determine whether it complies with the standards and criteria established pursuant to Education Code 33127 and determining whether the second interim budget will allow the district to meet its financial obligations during the current fiscal year and is consistent with a financial plan that will enable the district to satisfy its multi-year financial commitments.

Based upon our review, the Board's POSITIVE certification of the second interim budget report has been approved.

# **BUDGETARY POSITION FOR NICASIO SCHOOL DISTRICT**


The District's second interim budget and multi-year projection reflects an improvement in budgetary position when compared to the first interim budget. The following graph depicts the District's estimated ending balance in the second interim budget and multi-year projection for the unrestricted general fund, with both the state required minimum reserve and the District's actual reserve as a percentage of total expenditures.



The last several years have seen substantial one-time revenues that have helped in meeting the many competing demands, however, the one-time nature of these revenues will not support ongoing costs over time. Although the Governor's budget proposal includes approximately \$295 per average daily attendance (ADA) in one-time revenues, we do not recommend including these potential revenues in budget projections at this time.

# **OPERATING DEFICITS**

The District's second interim budget and multi-year projection continues to reflect operating deficits in the unrestricted general fund as displayed in the following chart below.



The cumulative impact of this projected deficit spending is a 24% decline in fund balance over the current plus two subsequent years, leaving the District with reserves of \$279 thousand or 25% of general fund expenditures at June 30, 2020. While some deficit spending may be a result of one-time costs from prior year funding sources, ongoing structural deficits threaten a school district's future educational programs. Districts that wait too long to address and correct structural deficits are forced to make dramatic corrections all at once. In contrast, carefully planned and phased-in structural corrections lessen the impact on children.

### FEDERAL BUDGET

The federal government recently passed the fiscal 2018 omnibus bill funding the federal government through September 2018. The federal fiscal 2018 budget funds the 2018-19 state budget for federal programs at or slightly above 2017-18 funding levels. Although the Administration proposed reducing the Education Department's budget by 13%, and eliminating certain programs, the omnibus bill provided a slight increase in total funding maintaining the programs districts depend upon.

The California Department of Education (CDE) recently released the LCAP Federal Addendum, a key element of the compliance requirements for federal funding under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). In addition, a working group convened by CDE has been meeting to develop a common set of accounting guidelines for districts to comply with ESSA regulations requiring districts to report per pupil expenditures at the school and district level beginning in 2018-19. We continue to monitor the programmatic, fiscal and reporting changes related to the ESSA to ensure we can provide districts with the most relevant guidance and training.

#### RESERVES

The District maintains the state-required minimum reserve for economic uncertainty of \$66 thousand in the current and two subsequent years. In addition, we note the District maintains a Board reserve for economic uncertainty of \$180 thousand for a total reserve of \$246 thousand in all three years of the budget and multi-year projection. All school districts, whether state aid or community funded, are well advised to establish higher than minimum reserves in order to provide for the financial flexibility to absorb unanticipated expenditures without significant disruption to educational programs, cash flow deferrals and general economic uncertainties. Higher

than minimum reserves allows the District to better ensure a consistent and stable program offering for students.
